Materials List

Quilt Top

- 3 coordinating fabrics of 3, 1 yard cuts

Backing Fabric

- 3 yards of fabric

Other Materials

- Twin-size batting
- Sewing thread to match fabric

This is an economy quilt designed to efficiently utilize 44" wide fabric. A single fold binding is used. An additional 1/2 yard of fabric is needed for a double fold binding. Binding Tutorial available at fabriccafe.com. WOF means "width of fabric".

Cutting Instructions

From fabric #1:

* Cut 3, 7½" x WOF; from these strips, cut 18, 7½" x 6½" **Block "B"**

* Cut 5, 2" x WOF for border #2

From fabric #2:

* Cut 4, 2" x WOF for **Strip Assembly "A"**

* Cut 2, 4½" x WOF for **Strip Assembly "B"**

* Cut 1, 2" x WOF; from this strip, cut 4, 2" x 2" squares for **Corner Blocks**

* Cut 5, 2½" x WOF for border #1

From fabric #3:

* Cut 2, 4½" x WOF for **Strip Assembly "A"**

* Cut 4, 2" x WOF for **Strip Assembly "B"**

* Cut 5, 2" x WOF for border #3

* Cut 6, 1¼" x WOF for binding

From Backing Fabric:

* Cut 2, 54" x WOF

Step 1: Unit "A" & "B" Assembly

Referring to **Strip Assembly "A"** diagram, using 2 fabric #2, 2" x WOF strips and one fabric #3, 4½" x WOF strip, sew together on long edges as shown. Cut into 36, 2" x 7½" **Unit "A"**.

Referring to **Strip Assembly "B"** diagram, using one fabric #2, 4½" x WOF strip and 2 fabric #3, 2" x WOF strips, sew together on long edges as shown. Cut into 18, 3½" x 7½" **Unit "B"**.

Step 2: Block "A" Assembly

Referring to **Block "A"** Assembly diagram, using one **Unit "A"**, sew to side of **Unit "B"** as shown. Repeat on opposite side. Repeat making 18, 6½" x 7½" **Block "A"**.

Optional: Ribbon Appliqué

Referring to **Ribbon Appliqué**

Pattern, appliqué one ribbon to center of each **Block "A"**.

Step 3: Quilt Assembly

Referring to **Quilt Assembly** diagram, alternating **Blocks "A"** and **"B"** as shown, assemble 6 rows of 6 blocks each.

Step 4: Borders

For border #1, using fabric #2, 2½" x WOF border strips, sew together end to end. Sew strip to each side of quilt; trim even with top and bottom. Using remainder of strip, sew to top and bottom; trim even with sides. For border #2, repeat using fabric #1, 2" x WOF border strips.

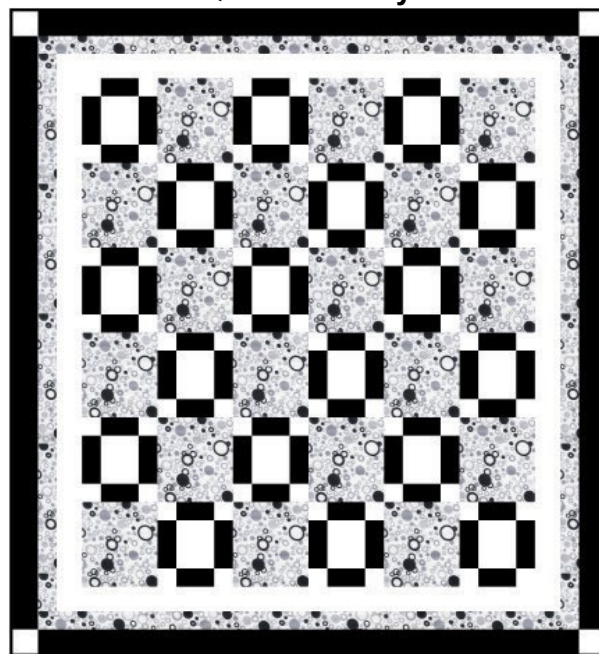
For border #3, using fabric #3, 2" x WOF border strips, sew together end to end.

Measure across the top of quilt; cut two strips equal to this measurement. Sew one fabric #2, 2" x 2" **Corner Block** to each end of these strips. Set strips aside. Using remainder of border strip, sew strip to each side of quilt; trim even with top and bottom. Sew one border strip with **Corner Blocks** to each top and bottom of quilt.

Step 5: Backing & Binding

Sew backing fabric together along trimmed selvage edges; press. Layer top, batting and backing together; quilt as desired. For binding, using fabric #3, 1¼" x WOF binding strips, sew strips together end to end. Press in half with wrong sides together; press one raw edge to center fold. Place right side of binding to front side of quilt. Using a scant ¼", sew unpressed edge of binding to quilt, mitering corners. Fold to back and hand stitch in place.

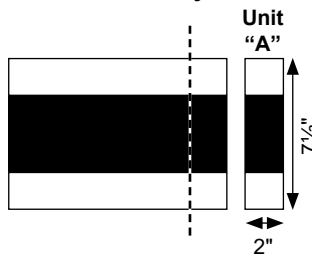

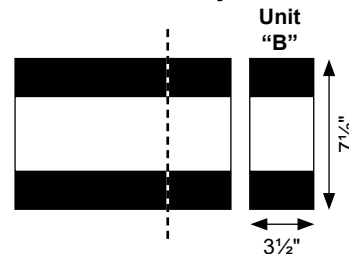


Strip Assembly "A"



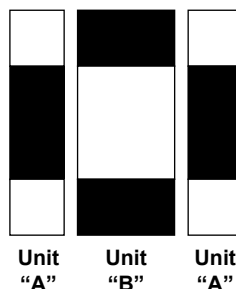
Make 2 assemblies.

Strip Assembly "B"



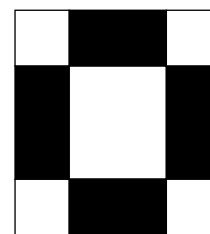
Make 2 assemblies.

Make 18, 6½" x 7½" **Block "A"**

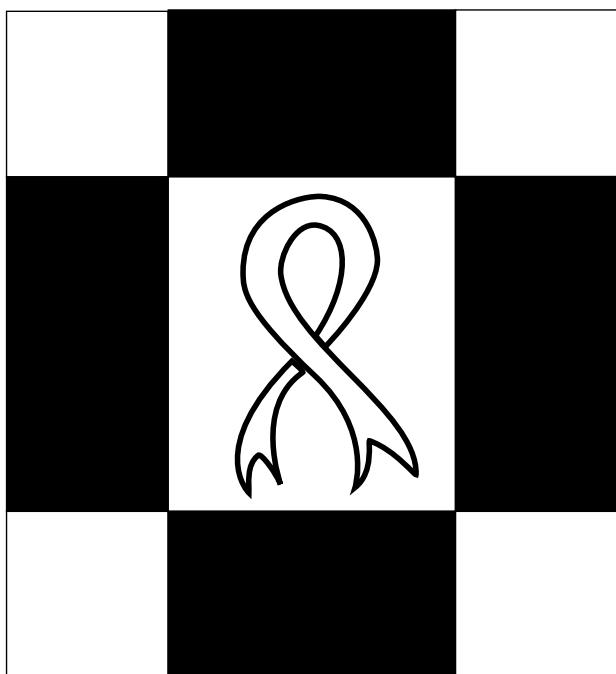
Awareness Ribbon Applique Pattern

While the Pink Ribbon for Breast Cancer Awareness remains the most recognized of all Awareness Ribbons, there are many more. An online search will provide the meaning of the colors. This quilt can be personalized to bring awareness to any cause that is dear to your heart or to provide a comforting reminder to a loved one that they are not alone.

Use this pattern to appliqué a ribbon to the center of one block or to each **Block "A"** as shown.

Block "A"

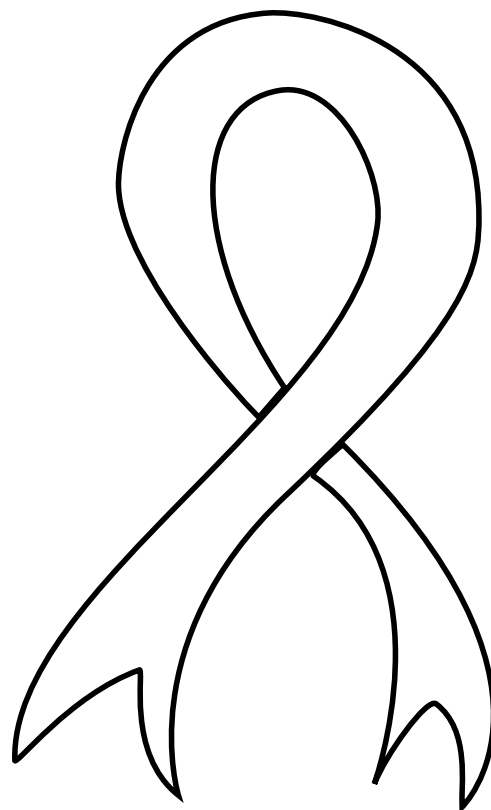
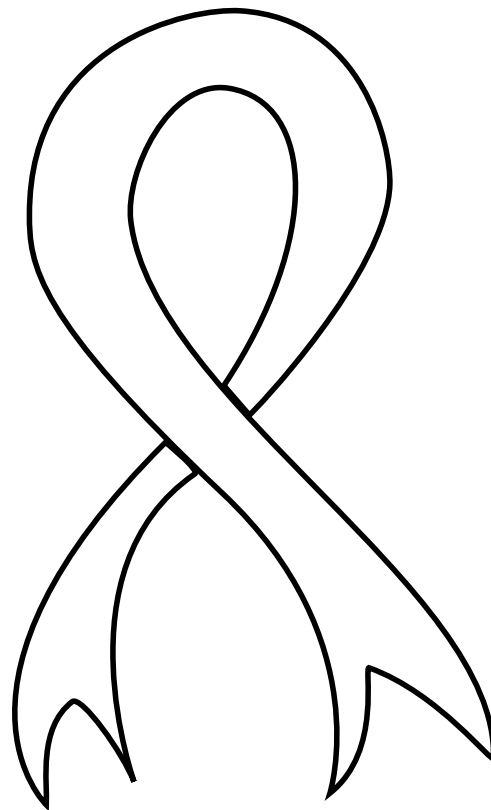


Instructions:

Trace chosen appliqué pattern to paper side of light weight fusible web. Cut around traced lines leaving a small margin.

Fuse to wrong side of fabric and cut out on drawn line.

Referring to manufacturer's instructions, fuse to center of **Block "A"**.



Pattern reversed for your convenience
