My name is Kallia Walkowiak, I am a 28-year-old fiber artist and instructor in the greater Milwaukee Area, as well as a daytime seamstress working in bridal alterations. I have been fascinated by all things fiber, textile, and traditional craft since I was a very young child. Currently I spend most of my time working and sharing what I know through fiber art classes and workshops.

## History of Sewing Methods

The talk will explore some of the differences between modern and historical practices of cutting, sewing, and construction, both for garments and other common textile applications. We will look at the different attitudes towards fabric, material, and construction, as well as some aspects of maintenance and care. We will take some time to examine and understand our modern attitudes towards fabric and clothing through the lens of a historical perspective, to see what things have understandably fallen by the wayside, and what things may still have more modern relevance than we tend to think about.


# Raffle Quilt 2025 from Evelyn Burdick and Betty Altman

We plan on making a variation on the Irish Chain called Loyal Heights Irish Chain. It's a very simple block which is just a variation on a 9 patch. Our color theme is medium blue fabrics and white background (white please, not off white). Blocks will be 8 ½ inches in size (8 inches when finished in quilt). Please bring your finished blocks to the December Holiday Party.

### To make one block:

Blue fabric- cut four 2 ½ inch squares and one 4 ½ inch square White fabric- cut four 2 ½ by 4 ½ inch rectangles Large blue square goes in the middle of the 9 patch, 4 smaller blue squares in the corners, white rectangles in middle of sides

You may also donate plain white squares of 8 ½ inches for the alternating squares.
