WHAT: A hands-on day for all of us to gather together to make quilts for those in need (our charity quilt projects: Adult quilts of any size is our priority this year, these are much needed and appreciated; also, still accepting NICU quilts but they have enough of these).

WHEN: May 21, 2025, 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. (come for the full day or when you can) Bring a lunch!

WHERE: Our usual meeting location (basement of Northshore Congregational on Santa Monica). Large tables for sewing will be set up on the sides of the room for you to quilt and sew borders (if you bring your machine), the stage will be the location for ironing, and the tables in the middle will be for pinning the quilt sandwiches.

WHAT TO BRING: Bring your partially completed love and comfort quilts to finish, or just bring yourself! Bring what you can: your sewing machine, iron, ironing board, fabric, quilt tops, notions including safety pins and scissors. We have batting and backs (you are also welcome to bring these if you like). *WE NEED MORE QUILT TOPS*. We will have an assembly line to divide the tasks!

Please make more quilt tops in anticipation for the May 21st all day charity quiltathon. They can be any size, any fabric. Adult quilt tops are needed (we have enough NICU quilts) as there is a huge need for adult quilts-we donate them to numerous worthwhile local charities.

Quilt Show 2025 Update



NSQG Quilt Challenge for 10-2025 Quilt Show




The Quilt Challenge for the 2025 Quilt Show is to create a 12" finished square by interpreting the creative style of Wisconsin artist Lois Ehlert. Lois used simple shapes, bold/bright colors, and many types of mediums to create her collage illustrations.

Lois Ehlert was an artist and an illustrator born in Beaver Dam, WI in 1934. Her mother was a seamstress and her father was a carpenter. She learned to sew at age 8 and used her mother's fabric scraps to create art. Her father would also give her wood scraps to use.

Cutting and pasting things into a collage was her favorite technique. Her parents gave her a card table to use as her space and she said she continued to work on this same table thru her later years. She received a scholarship to Layton School of Art in Milwaukee, graduating in 1957. She began her career illustrating children's books. Her designs are unique because of the bold colors, crisp shapes and amazing creativity. Lois won the Caldecott Award for her book <u>Planting a Rainbow</u>. She went on to write and Illustrate 38 children's books, many of which are nature related. She died in Milwaukee at 86 in 2021. Among her most recognizable books are <u>Chicka Boom Boom</u>, Pie in the Sky, and <u>Color Zoo</u>.

The challenge is to create a 12" square finished block which can be inspired from one of her books, or a random idea using her style of geometric shapes, collage design, colorful fabrics-you choose. You can use any technique, among them pieced, appliquéd, woven. Be creative!



What happened to your fabric donations last year for Tanzania?

Thank you for your generous donations of fabric last year to the rural sewing center in northern Tanzania. See these photos showing the fabric (arrived in containers on ship, and then transported 800 miles) being sorted and the sewing center. Your donations will help this community make a living. They will sew school uniforms for children, sanitary products for women, clothing, etc. (note: the sewing center itself was built with donations from Whitefish Bay Christ Church).



Fr. Oswald bought the blue bins (when you buy the bin, you pay for the bin + shipping) with donated monies, and then the bins are loaded into a container and shipped across to the coast of Africa which took months (then driven in a truck to the small rural town). Mary helped collect additional fabric at Christ Church, so there were several bins sent.

Photos from our April 16th Program: Timna Tarr – "Stitched Mosaics"

Timna explained her technique of creating "photo realistic quilts". After printing a photo, she has it blown up to the finished size. She makes a grid on the newly sized photo, numbers the spaces, and then goes about selecting 2 ½" fabric squares to recreate the photo. She selects a color rule or theme to narrow down her choices.
